# Levels and Specialty Troops

How to Participate: Daisies and Brownies complete 3 of 5 steps, Juniors and Cadettes complete 4 of 5 steps, and Seniors and Ambassadors complete all 5 steps. Step 1 is required for all levels.

- 1. Girl Scout Knowledge
- 2. Award and Badge Explorer
- 3. Try out a Specialty
- 4. Redesign the Levels
- 5. Create your own Special Interest Troop


Each month will contain both research and activities which will need to be completed to earn the patch.

Ready to go ALL IN? Order all your monthly patches at once! The All-In order is \$30 and is due October 15. Patches will still be mailed out on a monthly basis but this option allows you to order all patches up front at the beginning of the year.

Patch orders are due the 15th of the following month. For example, October's patch registration is due November 15th. Each patch is custom designed and will be mailed out roughly 8-10 weeks after the order is due. Individual patches are \$3 each.

#### Try out a Specialty

The two official GSUSA specialty troops are Trailblazers and Mariners. Find an activity that touches one of these areas of interest and give it a try!

Within the first year, both levels must know and recite both the Girl Scout Promise and Law and also complete the options below. The "To serve God"
line in the Girl Scout
Promise is allowed to
be changed based on
the Girl Scout's
individual beliefs.

# **Trailblazer**

Complete the first level of three (3) concentrations including: hiking, camping, stewardship, survivorship, and adventure sports.



Daisies, Brownies, Juniors – Complete a step from one of the badges under the "Outdoor" Pillar. (Daisies: Outdoor Art Maker, Eco Learner, Snow or Climbing Adventure, Trail Adventure, or Buddy Camper. Brownies: Letterboxer, Outdoor Art Creator, Eco Friend, Bugs, Outdoor Adventurer, Hiker, Snow or Climbing Adventure, Trail Adventure, Cabin Camper. Juniors: Geocacher, Outdoor Art Explorer, Eco Camper, Flowers, Horseback Riding, Camper, Snow or Climbing Adventure Trail Adventure, and Eco Camper.)

Cadettes, Seniors, Ambassadors – Try shelter building, cooking outdoors differently than usual (ex. Solar oven, Dutch oven, etc.), High Adventure challenges, Primitive Camping, or just try something all-around new to you that is done outdoors.

### Mariner

Complete option A or B described below

- A. Mariners ON or IN water
  - 1. Acquire basic swimming skills by swimming fifty (50) yards using any stroke, and treading water fully clothed for three (3) minutes.
  - 2. Select a watercraft or water sport.

#### B. Mariners NEAR water

- 1. Learn basic skills to prevent drowning.
- 2. Select a focus area, such as marine or aquatic ecology.
- 3. Study and learn the safety protocol required for the focus area




#### Redesign the Levels

When Girl Scouts first began, there were only three "levels" and only girls ages 10 to 17 could participate. Now there are six levels and girls ages 5 to 17 can participate.

Ask your leader or an adult if they were in Girl Scouts as a child. If they say yes, how were the levels broken up then. How is it different from the current level breakdown?

Now, come up with your own idea for how Girl Scouts should be "leveled". You can even redesign names, uniforms, level colors, and badges. Include a description, and draw your picture in the box below.

In the beginning, troops were called "patrols" and programming was based on the military.
